BRAG, BEG AND BORROW

Brag: Publicize your Treatment Court!

Beg: Ask for what you need!

Borrow: (ask steal) Copy great ideas! CASE LAW- Copy and Steal EVERYTHING!



Why do you need a written sustainability plan?

- To raise or obtain funding
- To build in quality control measures
- ✓ To minimize your risk of failure
- To achieve better results
- To enable you to track your growth



Why do you need a written sustainability plan?

- To update your plans and operations
- To get the commitment and participation of those involved

The planning process often is as useful as the document itself



What should be included in your sustainability plan?

- ✓ Summary
- Opportunity
- People at the table
- Memorandums of Agreement

Implementation

- ✓ What needs to happen
 - before implementation?
- ✓ Steering Committee?
- ✓ Media?



Data and Evaluation

- Do you recognize the importance of having an evaluation plan?
- ✓ Who? What? When? Where? Why?
- Clear, measurable & attainable goals



Marketing

- Have you "marketed" the accountability court to the community?
- Have you conducted
 accountability court
 education programs?
- Brochures? Posters?



WHAT YOU NEED TO CONSIDER

Develop a Funding Plan

- Monetary and Non-Monetary Sources
- Incorporate into Strategic Plan
- Review Annually

Sustainability Leads to Institutionalization

WHAT YOU NEED TO CONSIDER

Contingencies

- Do you have a plan outline when things go wrong?
- Are you prepared to respond to these and other problems as they emerge?

 Capacity in Adult Drug Courts (SAMHSA: Treatment Drug Courts)
- Grants to Expand Substance Abuse Treatment
 Capacity in Tribal and Juvenile Drug Courts
 (SAMHSA: Treatment Drug Courts)

STATE FUNDING

State Highway Traffic Safety Offices

NHTSA appropriates money to states to implement and enhance DWI courts.

Direct Legislative Appropriation

For court administration & treatment. (*i.e., Oklahoma \$18 million per year in dedicated funding from general budget*)

Dedicated Court Fund

2% surcharge on gross sale of beverage alcohol (*i.e., Idaho projects* \$1.5 *million per year (2001)*

Court Assessments

Administrative assessment or tax on each criminal case, assessment on bench warrants and DUI cases

LOCAL FUNDING

County Funding

County General Fund Appropriations

Municipal or City Funding

i.e., JAG grants, Community Block Grants (drug testing, literacy)

Criminal Justice Authorities

Funding to reduce crime & lighten jail populations – personnel (sheriff deputies, jail screeners)

Foundations

Fund specific program components, personnel, rent, incentives, childcare, scholarships

REALITY CHECK

Grants are Short Term

Grants are Competitive

They are not an Entitlement

There are No Guarantees

PARTNERSHIPS



PARTNERSHIPS

Collaborate

On grants or funding requests with other agencies. They may write and administer the grant. *i.e., Literacy Grant to Dollar Grant*

Service Referral Networks

Refer clients to government agencies. *i.e., Voc-Rehab (job training, education) DSHS (child support assistance)*

Community Social Service Agencies Referrals to medical care, dental, housing, food, infant care, etc.

INTERNAL RESOURCE SOLUTIONS

Events

Fundraising-races, golf tournaments, etc. Get local club to adopt you, organize a fundraiser and give you the money!!

User Fees

Participant user fees can fund indigent drug testing and client incentives. *i.e., Tulsa collects \$45-50k per year.*

Donations

Set up or partner with 501(c)(3) for donations of money, scholarships, or gift cards
