At the end of fiscal year 2022, there were 171 accountability courts and program tracks:

53 Adult Felony Drug Courts 2,081 Participants

40 Mental Health Courts 769 Participants

21 DUI Courts 836 Participants

21 Veterans Courts 185 Participants

23 Family Treatment Courts 316 Participants

13 Juvenile Drug/Mental Health Courts 103 Participants



Executive Summary

Georgia's accountability courts seek to provide research supported and cost-saving alternatives to incarceration. In Fiscal Year 2022 (FY 2022), participants in Council of Accountability Court Judges' (CACJ) certified programs engaged in evidence-based treatment, ancillary services, monitoring in the community, and a focus on individual goals supervised by multi-disciplinary team members.

In FY 2022, accountability courts continued to serve participants despite challenges caused by the ongoing effects of the pandemic. Georgia's courts are still recovering from significant case backlogs, which undoubtedly impact accountability courts' referrals and admissions. Despite these challenges, Georgia's accountability courts accepted more participants in FY 2022 compared to FY 2021. A consistent theme for FY 2022 was a focus on Georgia's accountability court standards and best practices; the foundation from which our courts were built. This was evidenced by the CACJ's 2022 annual training conference's title, "Back to the Future of Accountability Courts." CACJ continues to focus on increasing the number of participants served in Georgia's accountability courts and increasing fidelity to the accountability court model.

These data¹ should be interpreted within the context of the ongoing, residual impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on Georgia's courts and CACJ's data integrity efforts.







Drug of Choice

The most frequently reported primary drug of choice for FY 2022 was meth (amphetamines), followed by alcohol and marijuana.

In DUI Courts, alcohol was the most reported primary drug of choice.






Program Participation Produces Positive Outcomes

Across all program types, **57%** of adult and juvenile participants who exited in FY 2022 either graduated or completed the program.

"Any amount of participation in an accountability court, regardless of completion, leads to lower recidivism."






According to recent research conducted by the Carl Vinson Institute of Government⁶, each adult graduate from an accountability court produces \$25,921 in economic impact to the state of Georgia. FY 2022 adult graduates netted estimated total economic benefits of \$41 million.

Treatment Promotes Employment

Employment at graduation is a key objective of program participation and a data element that is statutorily mandated for reporting.


Participants who exited an accountability court program in FY 2022 were more likely to be employed than when they entered the program.

Eighty-six percent of adult participants who exited an accountability court program in FY 2022 were employed, and **91% of**



graduates were employed.






Program Participation has Positive Economic and Social Impact
